Wonderware License Server Insecure 3<sup>rd</sup> Party component usage

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### **Overview**

AVEVA Software, LLC. (“AVEVA”) has created a security update to address an outdated and insecure 3<sup>rd</sup> party component used in:

- **Wonderware License Server 4.0.13100 and older**

The vulnerability, if exploited, could result in remote code execution with administrative privileges. Wonderware License Server is delivered by **Wonderware Information Server 4.0 SP1 and older** and **Historian Client 2014 R2 SP1 P02 and older**.

### **Recommendations**

Customers using the Counted Licenses feature with “ArchestrAServer.lic” in **Wonderware License Server 4.0.13100 or older** are affected and should apply **Hotfix Wonderware License Server VU-485744**.

### **Vulnerability Details, Characterization, and CVSSv3 Rating**

The vulnerability exists in Flexera Imgrd v11.13.1.1 and older, a 3<sup>rd</sup> party component used by Wonderware License Server. Please refer to Flexera [VU-485744](#) for further details.
